

BIA Assessments with People who have Learning Disabilities



Aims

People who have learning disabilities and live in registered residential care settings or hospitals and lack mental capacity to consent to this are frequently eligible for Deprivation of liberty Safeguards authorisations. The numbers of people who have learning disabilities requiring assessment by BIAs has greatly increased since the Supreme Court's judgment on the P v Cheshire West and P and Q v Surrey cases in March 2014, requiring BIAs to be aware of the needs of these individuals.

This course aims to assist qualified best interest assessors to make best use of their skills when completing DOLS assessments in learning disability settings, considering the particular challenges of this client group, applying this knowledge to each of the BIAs assessments and reviewing relevant case law.

Delegates will have an opportunity to understand different models of learning disability services and to explore how to best undertake BIA assessments with adults who have a variety of learning disabilities.

Programme

The course will cover the following key topics:

- Learning disability services, a brief history of service models and trends
- Assessing quality services for people with learning disabilities - what to look for when assessing in a service
- Assessing mental capacity with people who have learning disabilities
- No Refusals assessment – working with LPAs, Court Appointed Deputies and families
- Best Interests – identifying care and treatment
- Restrictions and deprivation of liberty, identifying restraint, support and supervision
- Participation, how do we involve the person in their assessment and identify their wishes and feelings
- Assessing risk, what is reasonable and proportionate?

Exercises will consolidate the learning process and allow delegates to explore the subject matter in more depth. The day will end with a question and answer session to clarify any outstanding queries.
